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GENERAL INFORMATION

Columbus State Community College was founded in 1963 as the Columbus Area Technician School. The College was named Columbus Technical Institute from July 1, 1967 through June 30, 1987. The name of the College changed to Columbus State Community College effective July 1, 1987.

Columbus State Community College is accredited by The Higher Learning Commission, a member of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. The College is on a semester-based academic calendar as of Autumn 2012. Prior to Autumn 2012, Columbus State Community College operated on a quarter-based academic calendar.

Credits earned under the quarter-based calendar have had a one-time conversion to semester equivalent credit applied. Credit hours, grade points and cumulative grade point averages prior to the conversion statement are listed in quarter-based values. Credits earned Autumn 2012 and forward are reflected as semester credits.

COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM

From 1963 through Winter Quarter 1993 course numbers are a four-digit numeric identifier (e.g. CSCC 1002). Beginning Spring Quarter 1993 course numbers are either three or four character alpha with a three digit numeric identifier (e.g. HUM 111 or ENGL 101). Beginning Autumn Semester 2012 course numbers are either three or four character alpha with a four digit numeric identifier (e.g. BIO 2300 or ENGL 1100). Bridge courses offered for courses 'bridging' the quarter to semester transition will be identified with a three or four character alpha identifier and a four digit numeric identifier prefaced with a 'B' (e.g. ENGL B1100). These courses, available from Autumn Semester 2012 through Summer Semester 2013, contain the curriculum traditionally offered in the quarter system and allow the student to complete the course series through the transition from the quarter academic calendar to the semester academic calendar.

CLASS RANKING

Student rank at the College is based on the total credit hours completed. Students with 0.00-30.00 earned credit hours are considered to be in their first year and those with greater than 30.00 earned credit hours are considered to be in their second year.

REPEAT OF A COURSE (Rpt)

When a student repeats a course, only the most recent grade is computed in the student's grade point average. The prior grade(s) for the course(s) will remain on the transcript. "Rpt" will appear in the repeat (Repeat) column indicating the student repeated the course in a later term.

PROGRESS (P)

A non-grade symbol of "P" was formerly used to indicate PROGRESS in a course that is not completed within a quarter and was to be continued through a second quarter. This symbol is not currently issued.

NON-TRADITIONAL (N)

Student submits documentation of prior learning which is formally assessed as equivalent to the goals and objectives required in a specific College course.

VANISHED (V)

Student ceased to attend a course without the formal withdrawal process. This symbol is not currently issued.

EXAMINATION/PROFICIENCY (X)

A student may, upon department chairperson's approval of the student's petition, be permitted to take a proficiency examination for credit. Permission is given only in cases when it is evident that previous experience or study warrants.

ADMINISTRATIVE WITHDRAWAL (AW)

A student may, upon a committee's approval of the student's petition, receive an Administrative Withdrawal. Approval is given only in cases when it is evident that the requirements have been met of the student being unable to withdraw from a course or courses prior to the posted deadline due to extenuating circumstances.

TRANSCRIPT AUTHENTICITY

Transcripts for most students enrolled since 1983 will be laser printed from the College's student information system in portrait format. A transcript will be official when it bears a facsimile signature of the Registrar.

The secure transcript paper has a blue background with the Columbus State Community College seal, visible fibers, and a chain-link pattern watermark. The "CS" logo on the face of this document is printed in thermo-chromatic ink. When briskly rubbed, the logo will fade. When the rubbing is stopped, the logo will return to its normal color. A black and white document is not official. Alteration, unauthorized duplication, or forgery of this official document may be a criminal offense.

Transcripts for many students enrolled prior to 1983 will be photocopied from a hard copy permanent academic record. The transcript will bear the facsimile signature of the Registrar and raised College seal.
